

## New Resource! Structure of the Maine Through Year Assessment Video

The Assessment Team has created a 5-minute <u>Structure of the Maine Through Year Assessment</u> video. This introductory video answers the following questions:

- What are the similarities and differences between the fall, winter, and spring administrations of the Maine Through Year Assessment?
- Which portions are diagnostic, which are summative, and what does that mean?
- How do the diagnostic and summative portions compare to the NWEA MAP Growth assessment?
- How are summative questions different from diagnostic questions?
- How are RIT scores and Maine-specific scale scores determined for the Maine Through Year Assessment, and how are they different?

Please note that pre-requisite knowledge for this video includes basic familiarity with the MAP Growth assessment and RIT scores. ## **Score Reports**

#### **Sharing Spring and Fall 2023 Reports with Families**

Sharing the Individual Student Reports (ISRs) from Spring 2023 with families is a requirement per the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). These ISRs can be downloaded from the Acacia platform in *Student Scores*. SAUs may supplement the ISRs with other reports and information, such as MAP Growth reports and district-level assessments, as well as with the newly developed Supplementary Page for Families. *See the next section for more information on this resource*.

For the fall administration of the Maine Through Year Assessment, there is no requirement to share a specific report with families. SAUs who have chosen to use an additional, different fall interim assessment have the option to share the results of that local assessment with families.

Some options for sharing student results data from the fall administration of the Maine Through Year Assessment with families include using the Dynamic Student Report available in Acacia and the Family Report from the MAP Growth platform. The Family Report, and other MAP Growth reports, will be available only for those students who were successfully rostered in the MAP Growth platform by their attending SAU by November 9, 2023.

Please note that the ISRs available in Acacia are for the spring assessment administration only. The ISRs report the Maine-specific scale score, which is generated only by the summative portion of the spring administration of the Maine Through Year Assessment. ## **Individual Student Reports: Supplementary Page for Families**

Individual Student Report (ISR) design is intended to an iterative process in which feedback is received from the field and stakeholders, and recommended and desired changes to the ISR are presented to the assessment vendor to determine the viability of those changes. The Assessment Team had the privilege of working with a group of education professionals from across the State of Maine to re-envision the ISR for future spring administrations. Maine DOE continues to work with our assessment vendor, NWEA, to determine what changes to the ISR are viable for spring 2024 and what improvements we can work towards for spring 2025.

Part of this work has included the development of a supplementary page for families, which can accompany both the current Spring 2023 ISR as well as the anticipated, new ISR for spring 2024. This supplementary page is currently available for all grades on the <a href="Maine Through Year Assessment website">Maine Through Year Assessment website</a>, under the <a href="Individual Student Report">Individual Student Report (ISR) Template Translations</a> drop-down menu. Translations into Maine's top languages are coming soon.

#### **MAP Growth Reports**

MAP Growth reports became available for students who were successfully enrolled in the MAP Growth platform by their SAU by November 9.

NWEA is currently developing resources to provide further clarification on the rostering process that SAUs must complete in the MAP Growth platform in order to receive Maine Through Year Assessment RIT score data integrated into MAP Growth reports. The MAP Growth product was developed to be a district rather than state assessment solution, and as a result, Maine DOE has no access to rosters or reports in the MAP Growth platform. Because Maine DOE Assessment Team members are unable to access this information in the MAP Growth platform, SAUs must reach out to NWEA Partner Support at (855) 430-1777 or <a href="techsupport@nwea.org">techsupport@nwea.org</a> to resolve any problems in rostering their students in the MAP Growth platform for the winter and spring administrations.

Please note that MAP Growth roster uploads for the fall 2023 administration were final as of November 9 and cannot be updated at this time.

The Maine DOE Assessment and Data Teams will continue to be responsible for rostering in the Acacia platform.

## Fall 2023 Student Score Data File (SSDF)

The Fall 2023 Student Score Data File (SSDF) is a csv file that will be available to District Assessment Coordinators for download from Operational Reports in Acacia <u>on December 6</u>. The original delivery date for this file was delayed due to the extension of the fall assessment administration window.

## **Questions & Answers: Scoring and Reporting**

## **Optional Winter 2024 Administration**

The winter administration of the Maine Through Year Assessment is optional. The window is from January 2 – February 16, 2024. The Acacia platform will open to SAUs for pre-administration activities, such as assigning accommodations and creating student groups, on December 11.

## **Daily Change Files**

As with the spring 2023 and fall 2023 administrations, daily roster change files will be loaded manually by an Assessment Team member into the Acacia platform each day. From Monday to Friday, it may take up to 36 hours to see rostering changes in Synergy reflected in the Acacia platform. If changes are made to Synergy after 8:00 PM on Friday, they will not appear in Acacia until Tuesday.

## **Removing Students from Acacia**

If you need to remove students from Acacia during the winter pre-administration window, for example due to the student being an alternate assessment participant, please email <a href="mailto:Krista.Averill@maine.gov">Krista.Averill@maine.gov</a> and cc: <a href="mailto:Kalua.Wilson@maine.gov">Kalua.Wilson@maine.gov</a>. Removal of students from the Acacia platform is a manual process that cannot be completed via the daily roster change file.

## **Professional Learning Opportunities**

#### **Understanding Scores from the Maine Through Year Assessment**

During this virtual workshop, participants will learn about the characteristics and purposes of the two score types produced by the Maine Through Year Assessment. Participants will interact with student RIT score and Maine-specific scale score data to develop a deeper understanding of the purpose and value of, as well as the similarities and differences between, these two measures of student performance.

Administration window – January 29, 2024 through March 8, 2024.

As the main point of contact, NAEP School Coordinators should be conducting steps to prepare for the upcoming administration of the assessment. School Coordinators and Onsite Technology Coordinators should be registered in the NAEP Assessment Management System. More than 25% of the Maine Schools selected for NAEP have either not designated a school coordinator or have a school coordinator that is not registered in the NAEP Assessment Management System. Principals can designate a school coordinator using this <u>link to a Microsoft Form.</u>

#### **Upcoming activities for School Coordinators include:**

- **Scheduling a Zoom meeting** with the NAEP Assessment Coordinator that leads the team scheduled to administer the assessment in the school.
- Reviewing the list of students selected for NAEP. The list of selected students is scheduled to become available on December 4, 2023. When this list becomes available, please review the list and assign assessment accommodations as indicated in the students' IEPs and/or 504 plans. The AMS has some helpful guidance.
- **Notifying families of the students.** Parent/guardian notification letters are available in English and Spanish with in the NAEP Assessment Management System. These letters are also available in the top

ten languages spoken by the families of Maine's students. The translations for the Parent Notification letters are located on the bottom of the <u>National and International Assessment page</u> of the Maine DOE Assessment Team Resources. *This is a new location.* The families of students selected for NAEP should be notified at least one week in advance. You may also elect to notify the parents of all students in the selected grade that their students may be selected to participate in the assessment.

• *Plan to be onsite and available* before as well as during the administration of the assessment on the day of the assessment.

## To prepare for the assessment's technology requirements, each On-site Technology Coordinator should:

- Work with school or district technology staff as necessary to add the email domain westatstudies.com to the safe senders list;
- **Complete or assist with safelisting URLs.** A complete list is located in the NAEP Assessment Management System.
- Schedule the Zoom meeting with the NAEP Assessment Coordinator assigned to your school.
- *Plan to be onsite and available* before as well as during the administration of the assessment on the day of the assessment.

#### Grade 12 Schools Only:

- *High School Transcript Study (HSTS) Coordinators* should be registered in the NAEP Assessment Management System.
- *High School Transcript Study tasks are available in the AMS* for submission of course catalogs and completion of the transcript information survey.
- \*\*Please reach out to the members of your school and/or SAU that are designated to assist with the preparation for NAEP to verify that they have received an invitation to register for the NAEP AMS from <u>DoNotReply-NAEP@westatstudies.com</u>.
- \*\*Those that have already registered may access the AMS by returning to <a href="https://ams.westatstudies.com/">https://ams.westatstudies.com/</a>
  - It is important that <u>DoNotReply-NAEP@westatstudies.com</u> is on the safelist or whitelist for the district/school.
  - Please have all staff that will be accessing the NAEP AMS check their junk mail/spam if the invitation to register has not been received.
  - The link in the invitation is time sensitive.
