### 2018-2019 School Funding Formula Changes

# Enacted Changes via PL 2017 Chapter 284:

- 2 year October 1 pupil count average (formerly April and October average)
- PreK-K student-teacher ratio established at 15: 1 (formerly 17:1)
- System administration per pupil amount established at \$92 with additional \$46 allocated for school units participating in regional management centers
- Targeted funds for disadvantaged student programming

- Repeal of EPS Transition percentage (formerly 97%)
- Changes to special education allocation components to direct additional funds to meet needs
- 2 year average state valuation (formerly a 3 year average)

#### **Proposed Changes:**

- Program cost model for CTE (formerly expenditure model)
- Allocation of funds for CTE Middle School Programming



### Increase Instructional Expenditures to Benefit Students

- Instructional Expenditure Targets Enacted via PL 2017 Chapter 284
  - FY 2018-2019 = 61%
  - FY 2019-2020 = 63%
  - FY 2020-2021 = 65%
  - FY 2021-2022 = 67%
  - FY 2022-2023 and each succeeding year = 70%

Instruction is defined as regular classroom instruction, special education instruction, CTE instruction, summer school, alternative education, co and extra curricular instruction, ELL instruction and gifted and talented instruction.



# **EPS Model Components**

## Essential Programs and Services Components

#### Operating Costs

- Instructional and support staff salaries and benefits
- Per-pupil amounts included for Substitutes, Operation & Maintenance of Plant, Supplies & Equipment, System Administration, Professional Development, Instructional Leadership Support and Co-Curricular & Extra-Curricular
- Per-pupil weights for Economically Disadvantaged (includes additional targeted weight), Limited English Proficiency, Student Assessment, Instructional Technology and K-2.
- Isolated Small Schools adjustment

#### Other Subsidizable Costs

- EPS Special Education Model
- Special Education High Cost Out of District Allocation
- EPS Transportation Operating Model
- Bus Purchases
- Gifted & Talented
- CTE Middle School Programming per proposed legislation



#### EPS Model Components and Adjustments to State Share

- Essential Programs and Services Components
  - Debt Service
    - State Approved Major Capital Debt,
    - Lease, Lease Purchase, and Insured Value Factor Costs
  - Normalized Cost of Teacher Retirement
  - Adjustments to subsidy:
    - Minimum subsidy, minimum special education, minimum debt service and minimum economically disadvantaged adjustments
    - Education in Long-term drug treatment centers
    - Bus refurbishing
    - Maine Care Seed adjustment
    - Funding for regionalization, consolidation and efficiency
  - Enhancing Student Performance and Opportunity:
    - College transitions program through adult education
    - National Industry-standards for Career and Technical Education
    - Career and Technical Education Middle School Pilot Programs and Allocation for grades 9-12 per proposed legislation
