An Administrative Review of the Biddeford Public Schools Nutrition Program was conducted on February 1, 2019.

The enclosed Official Notification of Review Findings and Corrective Action describes the corrective action documentation and completion dates discussed during the exit conference. Please return a signed copy of this Official Notification when submitting the corrective action documentation. Please provide the corrective action documentation by April 1, 2019. Failure to do this may result in the withholding of reimbursement payments until it is received and/or a follow-up visit verifies that corrective action has been determined as acceptable. We hope that following the exit conference you and your staff addressed the corrective actions and that you will have no problems in meeting the response deadline.

The Official Notification also provides the potential fiscal action, which is an initial estimate of the amount of reimbursement that will be reclaimed. These are only estimates which must be adjusted to the actual date of corrective action for each violation. If documentation of corrective action or acceptable corrective action is not received by the response date stated above, the claim will be recalculated to the end of the school year.

Administrative Review Report Biddeford School Nutrition Program February 1, 2019

Introduction

The Biddeford School Nutrition Program was reviewed. Biddeford Primary School was selected to represent the district based on Federal Regulation 7CFR 210.18 and Maine Department of Education, Child Nutrition policies and procedures.

Performance Standard 1: Meal Access and Reimbursement

<u>Certification and Benefit Issuance</u>- All reviewed eligibility determinations were approved correctly. No findings.

Verification - No findings.

Meal Counting and Claiming- No findings.

Performance Standard 2: Meal Pattern and Nutritional Quality

<u>Meal Components and Quantities</u>- The red/orange vegetable sub-group offerings were shy of the required ³/₄ cup over the week. This was due to the type of vegetable juice offered with the bag lunch. This will be corrected by switching to a different vegetable juice which credits towards the red/orange sub-group.

Resource Management

For SY 2018, revenues and expenses were obtained from the Monthly Income and Expenses report found in NEO to calculate the following operational ratios:

General Program Compliance

<u>Civil Rights</u> – The non-discrimination statement on eligibility letters needed updating to reflect the most current statement. This was completed prior to the on-site review. No further action is needed.

Smart Snacks Competitive Foods Rule- No findings.

<u>Food Safety and Sanitation</u>- Health Inspection reports were displayed for public view; a sample meal and temperature logs were available; and a written food safety Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) were on file. No findings.

Buy American- Canned pears and peaches from the review period were found to be produced in China, however were supported by the price differential exception. Products must be reviewed during ordering and receiving for compliance with the Buy American provision.

Wellness Policy- The wellness policy is in the process of being revised to be compliant with the most recent requirements. A copy of the final, approved policy will need to be submitted to the reviewer.

Training/Professional Standards- Program staff are on track to meet their required training hours.

After School Snack Program- An on-site observation was conducted at Biddeford Intermediate School. No findings.

Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program (FFVP)- No findings.

Corrective Action- Corrective action is required as a result of this Administrative Review. The enclosed form outlines what is required. A detailed response and documentation of the corrective action must be returned to our office by the date specified, along with the enclosed form signed by the Superintendent.
