An Administrative Review of the RSU 73 Schools Nutrition Program was conducted on February 11, 2019.

The enclosed Official Notification of Review Findings and Corrective Action describes the corrective action documentation and completion dates discussed during the exit conference. Please return a signed copy of this Official Notification when submitting the corrective action documentation. Please provide the corrective action documentation by April 22, 2019. Failure to do this may result in the withholding of reimbursement payments until it is received and/or a follow-up visit verifies that corrective action has been determined as acceptable. We hope that following the exit conference you and your staff addressed the corrective actions and that you will have no problems in meeting the response deadline.

The Official Notification also provides the potential fiscal action, which is an initial estimate of the amount of reimbursement that will be reclaimed. These are only estimates which must be adjusted to the actual date of corrective action for each violation. If documentation of corrective action or acceptable corrective action is not received by the response date stated above, the claim will be recalculated to the end of the school year.

# Administrative Review Report RSU 73 School Nutrition Program 2/11/19

#### Introduction

The RSU 73 School Nutrition Program was reviewed. Spruce Mountain Elementary School was selected to represent the district based on Federal Regulation 7CFR 210.18 and Maine Department of Education, Child Nutrition policies and procedures.

## Performance Standard 1: Meal Access and Reimbursement

<u>Certification and Benefit Issuance</u>- One application was found to be incomplete. This will need to be corrected.

<u>Verification</u>- The correct timeline for the change in benefits due to verification was not used. Corrective action will be required.

<u>Meal Counting and Claiming</u>- A review of the menu and production records showed that the meal pattern requirements are being followed.

## Performance Standard 2: Meal Pattern and Nutritional Quality

### Meal Components and Quantities-

#### **Review Period**

One week of menus and production records were reviewed for the week of January 7, 2019. Based on the records provided all breakfast and lunch requirements were met.

#### Day of Review

All meal pattern requirements were met for both meals. It was observed that signage explaining what makes a reimbursable meal were missing. This was corrected during the on-site review.

**Production Records:** Production records are used to support the claiming of meals and therefore, must document the items offered and quantities served as part of a reimbursable meal. Production records were completed correctly.

#### Resource Management

For SY 2018, revenues and expenses were obtained from the Monthly Income and Expenses report found in NEO. RSU 73 does not receive town support.

<u>Meal Charging</u>- The School Nutrition Program does not have a charging policy/procedure. Corrective action will be required.

## General Program Compliance

<u>Food Safety and Sanitation</u>- Health Inspection reports were not displayed for public view, this was corrected while on site. A sample meal was available. Written food safety Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) were on file but had not been reviewed in a while, they are being reviewed on March 22, 2019

Civil Rights- No findings.

<u>On-Site Monitoring</u>- On-Site monitoring forms were reviewed and it was found that only one meal service at each school had been observed. Corrective action is required.

<u>Wellness Policy</u>- The draft wellness policy was reviewed and it exceeds the requirements of the Child Nutrition Programs. This policy will need to be approved by the board. Corrective action is required.

<u>Training/Professional Standards</u>- The staff at RSU 73 is on track to completing their professional standards hours. They are scheduled to complete their hours on March 22, 2019.

<u>Corrective Action-</u> Corrective action is required as a result of this Administrative Review. The enclosed form outlines what is required. A detailed response and documentation of the corrective action must be returned to our office by the date specified, along with the enclosed form signed by the Superintendent.

#### Summary

Dora York and the staff at RSU 73 run a wonderful program for the students in their district. The RSU 73 Nutrition Program does not receive any town support and Dora does a wonderful job monitoring her program costs to ensure that she does not exceed her income. It was a pleasure to work with Dora and her staff and I look forward to working with them in the future.
