## Procurement Review Report RSU 12 School Nutrition Program SY 2020

A procurement review of the RSU 12 School Nutrition Department was conducted to ensure compliance with Federal Regulations 2 CFR 200, 7 CFR 210, as well as applicable local laws.

Code of Conduct- No findings.

<u>Procurement Procedures</u>- As required by 2 CFR 200.318, documented procurement procedures were available. Code: DJ-R Administrative Procedure Federal Procurement Manual, was compliant with federal procurement regulations.

<u>Micro-Purchases</u>- Federal law requires that micro-purchases be reasonable and equitably distributed among qualified suppliers. Receipts must be kept as documentation. No findings.

<u>Small Purchases</u>- When making small or "informal" purchases, Federal law requires that at least two price quotes from suppliers be requested and documented and the purchase made from the lowest price from a responsible bidder. The program did not maintain documentation of price quotes from all vendors. Technical assistance was provided to Mike Flynn, Food Service Director.

<u>Formal Purchases</u>- RSU 12 is in a member if the Capital Area Co-Op buying group. Formal contracts for prime vendor and bread were reviewed. The findings are as follows:

- The solicitation was missing the following:
  - o applicable contract provisions and certifications
  - o Federal and State Non-discrimination statements
  - o Language that supports the use of small, minority and women's businesses, when possible
  - o Correct appeal process
  - o Code of Conduct
- · A final signed, written contract was not issued

## Required Corrective Action-

RSU 12 and the Capital Area Co-Op buying group need to revise the formal solicitation documents and re-bid prime vendor and bread for school year 2021. Submit revised documents to the reviewer by May 30, 2019 and a copy of the final signed contract by June 15, 2020.
