There will be a part time Gifted and Talented Coordinator for Grades Pre K-8 which results in a \$500 stipend. Supply needs will be \$500. Supplies include the Moby Max Computer Program, which allows for self-pacing and differentiation in all subjects. Supplies also include the Renzulli program which is essential for Identifying characteristics of giftedness. Finally, supplies include the IXL program which allows for self-pacing and is beneficial for tracking Common Core Standards as mentioned above. Travel needs will total \$300 for Whiting Village School, and will involve traveling school to school for Professional Development and Pupil Development Meetings.
