Re: Notification of Data Security Incident

Dear Attorney General Frey:

We represent Magavern Magavern Grimm LLP ("Magavern"), headquartered in Buffalo, New York, with respect to a recent data security incident described below. The purpose of this letter is to provide formal notice to your office.

1. Nature of the Security Incident

On December 2, 2022, Magavern detected unauthorized access to an email account. It immediately took steps to secure the account and engaged independent cybersecurity experts to conduct an investigation. As a result of this investigation, Magavern learned that there may have been unauthorized access to certain files and data stored within the email account. It then undertook a review of the potentially affected data and, on May 25, 2023, Magavern determined that personal information may have been affected by this incident.

2. Number of Maine Residents Affected

On June 20, 2023, Magavern notified one (1) Maine resident of this incident via first class U.S. mail. The affected information for the impacted individuals may have included a name in combination with the individuals' date of birth, driver's license or state ID number, financial account number with or without and associated PIN, medical information, health insurance information, and/or Social Security Number. A sample copy of the notification letter sent to impacted individuals is included with this correspondence.

3. Steps Taken Relating to the Incident

To help prevent something like this from happening again, Magavern is implementing additional security measures. It is also offering complimentary credit and identity protection monitoring to those individuals whose Social Security numbers may have been affected by the incident.

We then undertook a review of the potentially affected data and on May 25, 2023, we determined that your personal information may have been affected by this incident. There is no evidence that your information has been misused. However, out of an abundance of caution, we are notifying you about the incident and providing you with resources to help you protect your personal information.

What Information Was Involved: The information may have included your name and <<Breached Elements>>.

What We Are Doing: To help prevent something like this from happening again, we are implementing additional technical security measures. We are also providing you with information about steps that you can take to help protect your personal information. As a further precaution, we are offering you <<CM Length>> months of complimentary identity protection services through Equifax. Steps You Can Take to Protect Your Personal Information

Review Your Account Statements and Notify Law Enforcement of Suspicious Activity: As a precautionary measure, we recommend that you remain vigilant by reviewing your account statements and credit reports closely. If you detect any suspicious activity on an account, you should promptly notify the financial institution or company with which the account is maintained. You also should promptly report any fraudulent activity or any suspected incidence of identity theft to proper law enforcement authorities, your state attorney general, and/or the Federal Trade Commission (FTC).

Copy of Credit Report: You may obtain a free copy of your credit report from each of the three major credit reporting agencies once every 12 months by visiting <u>http://www.annualcreditreport.com/</u>, calling toll-free 1-877-322-8228, or by completing an Annual Credit Report Request Form and mailing it to Annual Credit Report Request Service, P.O. Box 105281, Atlanta, GA 30348. You also can contact one of the following three national credit reporting agencies:

Fraud Alert: You may want to consider placing a fraud alert on your credit report. An initial fraud alert is free and will stay on your credit file for at least one year. The alert informs creditors of possible fraudulent activity within your report and requests that the creditor contact you prior to establishing any accounts in your name. To place a fraud alert on your credit report, contact any of the three credit reporting agencies identified above. Additional information is available at http://www.annualcreditreport.com.

Security Freeze: You have the right to put a security freeze on your credit file for up to one year at no cost. This will prevent new credit from being opened in your name without the use of a PIN number that is issued to you when you initiate the freeze. A security freeze is designed to prevent potential creditors from accessing your credit report without your consent. As a result, using a security freeze may interfere with or delay your ability to obtain credit. You must separately place a security freeze on your credit file with each credit reporting agency. In order to place a security freeze, you may be required to provide the consumer reporting agency with information that identifies you including your full name, Social Security number, date of birth, current and previous addresses, a copy of your state-issued identification card, and a recent utility bill, bank statement or insurance statement.

Additional Free Resources: You can obtain information from the consumer reporting agencies, the FTC, or from your respective state Attorney General about fraud alerts, security freezes, and steps you can take toward preventing identity theft. You may report suspected identity theft to local law enforcement, including to the FTC or to the Attorney General in your state.
